SCRIPTURE LESSONS FOR TODAY

Exodus 31:18; 32:15-16

¹⁸ When the Lord had finished speaking with Moses on Mount Sinai, he gave him the two tablets of the Testimony, stone tablets, written with God's finger... ¹⁵ Moses turned and went down the mountain, with the two tablets of the Testimony in his hand—tablets that were written on both sides, written on one side and on the other. ¹⁶ The tablets were the work of God, and the writing was the writing of God, engraved on the tablets.

¹ Out of the depths I have called to you, O Lord. ² Lord, hear my voice. Let your ears be attentive to the sound of my cry for mercy. ³ If you, Lord, kept a record of guilt, O Lord, who

could stand? ⁴ But with you there is pardon, so you are feared.

Colossians 2:13-15

¹³ Even when you were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive with Christ by forgiving us all our trespasses. ¹⁴ God erased the record of our debt brought against us by his legal demands. This record stood against us, but he took it away by nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵ After disarming the rulers and authorities, he made a public display of them by triumphing over them in Christ.

John 8:1-11

8 But Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. ² Early in the morning, he came back into the temple courts. And all the people kept coming to him. He sat down and taught them. ³ Then the scribes and Pharisees brought a woman caught in adultery and had her stand in the center. 4 "Teacher," they said to him, "this woman was caught in the act of committing adultery. 5 In the Law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?" 6 They asked this to test him, so that they might have evidence to accuse him. Jesus bent down and started writing on the ground with his finger. ⁷ But when they kept on asking him for an answer, he stood up and said to them, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." 8 Then he stooped down again and wrote on the ground. 9 When they heard this, they went away one by one, beginning with the older men. Jesus was left alone with the woman in the center. 10 Jesus stood up and said to her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" 11 "No one, Lord," she answered. Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore."
