


[M]: We worship in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

[C]: Amen.


PRAYER AND PRAISE

THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Isaiah 52:1-6

A call to "wake up" and watch for Jesus to return!

Wake, awake! Clothe yourself with strength, O Zion. Put on your beautiful garments, Jerusalem, you holy city, for never again will the uncircumcised and the unclean enter you. ² Shake off the dust. Get up and take your seat, Jerusalem. Loosen the chains from your neck. you captive daughter of Zion. ³ Yes, this is what the Lord says. You were sold for nothing. and you will be redeemed without money. ⁴ Yes, this is what the Lord God savs. In the beginning, my people went down to Egypt to stay there for a while.

Later Assyria oppressed them without cause.

⁵ Now what do I have here? declares the Lord.
Indeed, my people have been taken away for nothing.
Their rulers howl with mockery, declares the Lord.
My name is continually despised all day.

⁶ Therefore my people will know my name.
So on that day they will know that I am the one—
the one who is saying, "Here I am!"

THE GOSPEL Matthew 25:1-13

The waiting church must be a watching church lest we lose both our invitation and our recognition!

"At that time the kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. ² Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. ³ When the foolish ones took their lamps, they did not take any oil with them; ⁴ but the wise took oil in their containers with their lamps. ⁵ While the bridegroom was delayed, they all became drowsy and fell asleep. ⁶ But at midnight there was a shout, 'Look, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!' ⁷ Then all those virgins got up and trimmed their lamps. ⁸ The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil because our lamps are going out.' ⁹ But the wise answered, 'No, there may not be enough for us and for you. Instead, go to those who sell oil and buy some for yourselves.' ¹⁰ But while they were away buying oil, the bridegroom came. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding banquet, and the door was shut.

¹¹ Later, the other virgins also came and said, 'Lord, Lord, let us in.' ¹² But he answered, 'Amen I tell you: I do not know you.' ¹³ Therefore, keep watch, because you do not know the day or the hour.

SERMON Revelation 19:1-9

After this I heard what sounded like the roar of a great multitude in heaven shouting:

"Hallelujah!

Salvation and glory and power belong to our God,

for true and just are his judgments.

He has condemned the great prostitute

who corrupted the earth by her adulteries.

He has avenged on her the blood of his servants."

³ And again they shouted:

⁴ The twenty-four elders and the four living creatures fell down and worshiped God, who was seated on the throne. And they cried:

"Amen, Hallelujah!"

M: Lord of life, the day is coming when you will come down from heaven with the voice of the archangel and the trumpet call of God. On that glorious day, the saints triumphant will rise in bright array, clothed in your perfect righteousness.

C: Give us strength until that day when we will share fully in the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.


WORDS OF INSTITUTION
