The Confession of Sins & Absolution

I have been jealous of the blessings that others enjoy and have hoarded the blessings you have given me. I have forgotten that everything I have comes from you and belongs to you. Forgive me for Jesus’ sake. And give me a thankful heart.

P: Our Lord Jesus washed your sins away on the cross. He announced to the whole world that we are at peace with God because he has risen from the dead proving to us that our sins are forgiven. Therefore, it is my privilege to say to you: “I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.” Amen.

P: Let us pray: Almighty God our Father, your generous goodness comes to us new every day. By the work of your Spirit lead us to acknowledge your goodness, give thanks for your benefits, and serve you in willing obedience; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Word of God

Deuteronomy 28:1-10

God promises to bless his people!

If you fully obey the voice of the Lord your God by carefully carrying out all his commandments that I am giving you today, then the Lord your God will set you high above all the nations of the earth. ² All of the following blessings will come upon you and overtake you, if you listen to the voice of the Lord your God:

³ You will be blessed in the city and blessed in the fields.

⁴ You will be blessed in the fruit of your womb, in the fruit of your soil, and in the fruit of your animals: the calves of your cattle and the lambs of your flock.

⁵ You will be blessed in your basket and in your kneading trough.

⁶ You will be blessed when you come in, and you will be blessed when you go out.

⁷ The Lord will cause your enemies who rise up against you to be defeated before you. From one direction they will come out against you, but they will flee from you in seven directions.

⁸ The Lord will command a blessing on you in your storehouses and in regard to every action of your hand, and he will bless you in the land that the Lord your God is giving you.

⁹ The Lord will establish you as his holy people, just as he swore to you, if you keep the commandments of the Lord your God and you walk in his ways.

¹⁰ Then all the people of the earth will see that the name of the Lord has been proclaimed over you, and they will fear you.

2 Corinthians 8:8-15

The Lord expects the gospel to inspire generosity.

⁸ I do not say this as a command, but to test how genuine your love is, by comparing it with the eagerness of others. ⁹ For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that although he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that through his poverty you might become rich.

¹⁰ And I am giving advice in this matter because it is going to be helpful for you. Last year, you were not only the first to take action, but also the first to be willing. ¹¹ Now bring the work to completion too, so that your eagerness to start may be matched by your completing it with what you have. ¹² For if the eagerness is there, a gift is acceptable according to what someone has, not according to what he does not have.

¹³ Certainly, our goal is not that others take it easy while you are burdened, but that there may be equality. ¹⁴ At the present time, your abundance will provide what they lack, in order that their abundance will also provide what you lack—in this way there will be equality. ¹⁵ As it is written, “The one who gathered much did not have too much, and the one who gathered little did not have too little.”

The Confession of Faith

I believe that God made me and every creature and that he gave me my body and soul, eyes, ears and all my members, my mind and all my abilities.

I believe that God still preserves me by richly and daily providing clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, cattle and all I own, and all

that I need to keep my body and life, and by defending me against all danger and guarding and protecting me from all evil.

All this God does only because he is my good and merciful Father in heaven, and not because I have earned or deserved it. For all this I ought to thank and praise, to serve and obey him. This is most certainly true.
