#### The Season of Christmas

For many, Christmas is about what is cute and trite and trivial. But there is nothing trite or trivial in what has happened today! The deepest lowliness into which Christ was born is but the mask for the greatest glory – the glory of him who came to be our Savior! In spirit we fall on our knees as did the shepherds to worship and adore the Child, the incarnate Son of God! ### The Festival of the Nativity

Nativus is Latin for "birth." By the fourth century, the early Christian Church had set December 25<sup>th</sup> as the day to celebrate the birth of Christ. Along with Easter, it quickly became one of the major celebrations in the Church Year. For many years the Christian church celebrated the Lord's Supper on this day. This is seen in the word Christmas, which is simply short for "Christ's Mass."

SECOND LESSON Hebrews 1:1-9

1 In the past, God spoke to our forefathers by the prophets at many times and in many ways. <sup>2</sup> In these last days, he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe. <sup>3</sup> The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact imprint of the divine nature. He sustains all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he took his seat at the right hand of the Majesty on high. <sup>4</sup> The Son became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs. <sup>5</sup> For to which of the angels did God ever say:

You are my Son. Today I have begotten you?

And again:

I will be his Father, and he will be my Son.

<sup>6</sup> And again, when he brought his firstborn into the world, he said:

Let all God's angels worship him.

<sup>7</sup> About the angels he says:

He makes his messengers winds and his ministers flaming fire.

<sup>8</sup> But about the Son he says:

God, your throne is forever and ever,

and the scepter of righteousness is the scepter of your kingdom.

<sup>9</sup>You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness.

Therefore God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of joy beyond your companions.

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. <sup>2</sup> He was with God in the beginning. <sup>3</sup> Through him everything was made, and without him not one thing was made that has been made. <sup>4</sup> In him was life, and the life was the light of mankind. <sup>5</sup> The light is shining in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. <sup>6</sup> There was a man, sent from God, whose name was John. <sup>7</sup> He came as an eyewitness to testify about the light so that everyone would believe through him. <sup>8</sup> He was not the light, but he came to testify about the light.

<sup>9</sup> The real light that shines on everyone was coming into the world. <sup>10</sup> He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not recognize him. <sup>11</sup> He came to what was his own, yet his own people did not accept him. <sup>12</sup> But to all who did receive him, to those who believe in his name, he gave the right to become children of God. <sup>13</sup> They were born, not of blood, or of the desire of the flesh, or of a husband's will, but born of God. <sup>14</sup> The Word became flesh and dwelled among us. We have seen his glory, the glory he has as the only-begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.





The Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you.


