Welcome by Pastor Olson

Invocation

Pastor: We worship in the name of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Amen!

The Confession of Sins

Pastor: We begin our worship tonight with reminders that the Light of the world has come in the birth of Jesus Christ. How brightly his light shines in a world that is shrouded in darkness. We live in a world that is mired in the darkness of unrest and strife. Jesus was born over 2000 years ago into this world darkened by troubled consciences and sin-sick souls. The Apostle John writes:

Congregation: "The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world. He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him" (John 1:9-11).

Pastor: We are those people of whom the Apostle John writes. We are among those people who have been blindfolded by sin, unable to see the light of Jesus' face shining brightly for our salvation. The Bible plainly tells us that if we say we are not darkened by sin we deceive ourselves, and the light of his truth is not in us. But if we confess our sins, God is faithful and just. He will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. With repentant hearts that are kindled by the flame of faith, we confess our sins to God pleading for his mercy for the sake of Jesus who was born to save us all!

Congregation: Dear Father in heaven, I have sinned against you and am no longer worthy to be called your child. My sins weigh heavy on my heart. I have been selfish and loveless in my actions toward you and toward my neighbor. You have every right to condemn me because of my sins. I plead for your mercy for the sake of Jesus, your Son, and my Savior.

Pastor: I bring you good news of great joy! In the town of David our Savior has been born! He is the light of the world, the light that no darkness can overcome! For by his humble birth, through his perfect life, by his sacrificial death, and in his glorious resurrection, God shines the glory of his favor upon you! Therefore, I say to you what God commands me to say: I forgive you all your sins for the sake of Jesus Christ our Savior!

Congregation: Amen!

Pastor: With hearts filled with joy we listen to the children of our school share the promises of Christ's birth to Old Testament believers. And we will hear them proclaim the good news that the promises have been fulfilled for us in Christ's birth! May God

bless these children – and all of us – with an increase of faith and hope as we hear their familiar messages!

7-8 Recitation

Narration: Throughout the Old Testament, God's people looked forward to the Good News of the coming Messiah, the Christ, the Anointed One, finally coming to earth to rescue people everywhere. The wait was long, yet now and again God sent a prophet to give the people added news of the coming Savior.

Recitation: Isaiah's Good news said that the Savior would be born of a virgin, "Therefore the Lord himself will give a sign for all of you. Look! The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and name him Immanuel." (Isaiah 7:14)

Recitation: Moses told the people some Good News when he wrote in Genesis 49:10, "The scepter will not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet.

until the one to whom it belongs comes. He will receive the obedience of the peoples."

Recitation: Micah added his own Good News in his fifth chapter, second verse when he wrote, "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah,

from you, will go out the one who will be the ruler for me in Israel. His goings forth are from the beginning, from the days of eternity"

Recitation: Jeremiah also had some Good News to tell in his chapter 23:5, "Listen, the days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, who will reign wisely as king and establish justice and righteousness on earth."

Narration: But the people of the Old Testament could only live in the promises of hope in the Good News. They would not see the Good News until the exact moment that God was ready to send His Son to earth.

Narration: Galatians 4:4-5 says, "But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son to be born of a woman, so that he would be born under the law, in order to redeem those under the law, so that we would be adopted as sons."

Narration: To those in the Old Testament it seemed like that day would never come. To us it seems so very long ago.

1-2 Recitation

Luke 2: 1-7

"In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first census taken while Quirinius was governing Syria. And everyone went to register, each to his own town. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the town of Nazareth, into Judea, to the town of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was from the house and family line of David. He went to be registered with Mary, his wife, who was pledged to him in marriage and was expecting a child.

And so it was that while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son, wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn."

3-4 Recitation

Luke 2: 8-20

"There were in the same country shepherds staying out in the fields, keeping watch over their flock at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified! But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. For behold, I bring you good news of great joy, which will be for all people: Today in the town of David, a Savior was born for you. He is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: You will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." Suddenly, there was with the angel a multitude from the heavenly army, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward mankind."

When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Now let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the

Lord has made known to us." So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they told others the message they had been told about this child. And all who heard it were amazed by what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told."

3-4 Song: What Child is This?

5-6 Recitation

Narration: The New Testament is filled with passages that tell us what Christians did with the Good News. The following examples are given to us in the Book of Acts:

"Every day, in the temple courts and from house to house, they never stopped teaching and proclaiming the good news that Jesus is the Christ." Acts 5:42

"He sent his word to the people of Israel, proclaiming the good news of peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all." Acts 10:36

- "...They preached the good news in that city and had gathered many disciples..."

 Acts 14:21
- "...Paul was preaching the good news about Jesus and the resurrection." Acts 17:18

"Philip went down to the city of Samaria and began preaching the Christ to them." Acts 8:5

"So those believers who were scattered went around proclaiming the gospel message." Acts 8:4

Recitation: Again, Paul writes in Romans 5:8, "But God shows his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Recitation: Jesus' disciple, John put it this way, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish, but have eternal life."

5-6 Song (Chimes): God Loved the World So That He Gave (Congregation will sing verses 1, 3 and 4 following the introductory verse with the chimes)

1 God loved the world so that he gave His only Son the lost to save That all who would in him believe Should everlasting life receive.

3 God would not have the sinner die-His Son with saving grace is nigh. His Spirit in the Word does teach How we the blessed goal may reach.

4 Be of good cheer, for God's own Son Forgives the sins that you have done. You're justified by Jesus' blood; Baptized, you are a child of God.

Lighting of the Christ Candle

Pastor: This is the night for which we have been waiting. The eternal Light, Jesus Christ, entered our dark world of sin by means of a humble birth. In our darkened hearts of sin God has sent his Spirit to enlighten our hearts by faith to shine with the glory of his grace!

An usher proceeds forward to light the Advent wreath candles, and the Christ candle in the center of the ring. As the candles are lit the congregation is invited to join in singing the hymn, "Joy to the World" as on the following page:

(Explanation of the second article of the Apostles' Creed, by Martin Luther)

Distribution of the Candles

Ushers will distribute the candles. Please help the ushers by passing the candles down your row until everyone has one. **Parents, please note**: if you don't wish to have your child holding a candle, please let the ushers know as they are distributing the candles to your row.

The Lighting of the Candles

Pastor Olson will light his candle from the Christ Candle, for our light and our life come from Jesus alone. The ushers will light their candles from pastor's candle. Those sitting closest to the center aisle will in turn light their candles from the ushers' candles. Continue by lighting all the candles in the row. **REMEMBER:** Be sure to dip your unlit candle into the lit candle to avoid spilling hot wax! As the candles are being lit, we will join in singing "Joy to the Word." When all the candles are lit, the overhead lights will be turned off and we will conclude our worship service in the glow of the candlelight. Please remember to keep your candle perpendicular to the floor at all times. Thank you!
