#### THE SEASON OF ADVENT

In Advent the Word of God bids us prepare for the coming of Christ. The readings for Advent have this urgency to them: Since he is surely coming again in judgment, we desperately need for him to come to us first in grace. For without that coming in grace we will perish at his coming in judgment. Since the word "advent" means "coming," it is good for us to be familiar with his coming as a Babe in Bethlehem, his coming into our hearts by faith, and his coming again on the last day!


#### THE ADVENT GATHERING RITE

Gathering rites have been used in the Christian worship service as a replacement for the opening section of the service in different seasons of the Christian church year. The Advent "gathering rite" enhances the sense of the season by emphasizing the Christian's longing for Christ to come and fulfill his promises to us. The verses sung by the cantors change each week in keeping with the theme of that Sunday in the season. Congregational participation allows all of us to become familiar with a basic theme and tune to take with us throughout the week contemplating the significance of the season in our everyday life.

### OUR WORSHIP SERVICE

A strange question for you to consider: "Do you want the Savior who promised to come?" Many didn't when Jesus arrived. John found that to be true as he wrote in the gospel lesson today. Many people just want the festivities of Christmas. They don't want the Light of salvation to shine exposing the ugliness of our sinful behavior. Perhaps it is a fair question for all of us: "What do you want for Christmas?"

## THE WORD OF GOD

## The Epistle Lesson: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

Cherish the message that comes from God's Word. Wrapped in that message are the most beautiful of Christmas presents, bought by Christ and carried to us by the Holy Spirit. The message prepares you for the real Christmas and for the real joy that God wants you to have in Christmas. It is the joy of peace with God even when conscience accuses; don't despise the preaching of that message as though it were old news not worthy of repetition. Test all the customs of Christmas in your heart and home and hold fast to those that focus on Christ. Shun the evil, the debauchery that many pass off as *Christmas Spirit*. The *Christmas Spirit* is the joy of holiness because of sin washed away. It is the joy of knowing that God is faithful and will not leave us or forsake us no matter what happens to us in this life; for the Light of the world is on his way, right around the corner, and he will not disappoint or fail to keep his Word!

<sup>16</sup> Rejoice always. <sup>17</sup> Pray without ceasing. <sup>18</sup> In everything give thanks. For this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. <sup>19</sup> Do not extinguish the Spirit. <sup>20</sup> Do not treat prophecies with contempt. <sup>21</sup> But test everything. Hold on to the good. <sup>22</sup> Keep away from every kind of evil.

<sup>23</sup> May the God of peace himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>24</sup> The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do it.

## The Gospel Lesson: John 1:6-8; 19-28


John was so excited to point the people to Jesus for the forgiveness of sins and the joy of salvation. But the people didn't seem to care to listen! John's joy was that he, unworthy though he be, was privileged to tell the world about Jesus! Make that your joy this Christmas!

<sup>6</sup>There was a man, sent from God, whose name was John. <sup>7</sup>He came as an eyewitness to testify about the light so that everyone would believe through him. <sup>8</sup>He was not the light, but he came to testify about the light. <sup>19</sup>This is the testimony John gave when the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him, "Who are you?" <sup>20</sup>He confessed and did not deny. He confessed, "I am not the Christ." <sup>21</sup>And they asked him, "Who are you then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" "No," he answered. <sup>22</sup>Then they asked him, "Who are you? Tell us so we can give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" <sup>23</sup>He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,'[s] just as Isaiah the prophet said." <sup>24</sup>They had been sent from the Pharisees. <sup>25</sup>So they asked John, "Why then do you baptize, if you are not the Christ, or Elijah, or the Prophet?" <sup>26</sup> "I baptize with water," John answered. "Among you stands one you do not know. <sup>27</sup>He is the one coming after me, <sup>[h]</sup> whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." <sup>28</sup>These things happened in Bethany beyond the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

### The Sermon: Malachi 4:1-6

4 "Surely the day is coming; it will burn like a furnace. All the arrogant and every evildoer will be stubble, and that day that is coming will set them on fire," says the LORD Almighty. 
