



COVID-19 Guidelines

2021-2022

St. Paul's will follow these La Crosse Health Dept. Recommendations:

- Monitor symptoms of child and keep home if sick
- Promote hand washing and covering coughs/sneezes
- Perform routine cleaning and disinfecting of common surfaces

The CDC encourages all eligible individuals to receive COVID-19 vaccination.

Furthermore, St. Paul's will continue to follow these practices:

- Masks are optional.
- Provide additional hand-sanitizer stations
- Follow the guidelines from the busing services

If someone tests positive for COVID-19, he/she can end isolation after five days as long as the following are met:

- No fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medicine;
- AND other symptoms have significantly improved/resolved;
- AND at least five days have passed since symptoms started.

If someone is fully vaccinated and is a household contact of someone who tested positive for COVID-19, he/she does NOT need to quarantine as long as the following condition is met:

- He/she has no symptoms.

If someone is not vaccinated and is a household contact of someone who tested positive for COVID-19, he/she can end quarantine after five days (back to school on day six) from the last exposure to the COVID positive person as long as the following condition is met:

- He/she has no symptoms.
