Deliver and restore us, that we may rest in peace.


# **ABSOLUTION**

**PSALM** *Psalm 130, p. 114* 






Out of the depths I cry to <u>you</u>, O LORD;\*


### **PSALM PRAYER**




# What to Remember When You Are Seized with Remorse
